# From Our Library

**Dic Drees**

This month I am writing a short review of Wood Finishing Fixes: Quick Answers to Over 175 Most Frequently Asked Questions, by Michael Dresdner. This book contains quick answers to many of the most frequently asked questions

about finishing on wood surfaces. I must say that I found this book to be right on the money with regards to questions and answers about finishing. It answers your finishing questions as they arise, instead of making you read an entire text on finishing.

The book is divided into logical chapters with clear, concise answers on how to avoid finishing problems and how to fix finishing problems. When you have a vexing situation, simply look up the solution in the appropriate chapter.

There are 7 chapters and the chapter headings are: The Right Finish; Preparing to Finish; Application Tools and Methods; Using Solvents and Strippers; Achieving the Right Color and Sheen; Repairing Finishing Disasters; and Maintaining and Caring for Finishes. Each chapter has between 10 and 29 questions and answers.

This book should get you out of almost any jam during the finishing process, but it does not go into great detail. If you need a more indepth discussion on how to accomplish some of the techniques mentioned in the book, you'll find the answers in regular texts written by Dresdner, Flexner, Jewitt, or any other finishing expert. and these books are also in the DPWW Library.

As an example of something I discovered when reading through this book: Q; Do I need to sand between coats when I am finishing? A: You don't have to sand between coats unless you need to remove finish irregularities or to flatten the surface. If it has been less than two weeks since the last coat was applied, there is no need to sand between coats. However, you should lightly sand with 320-grit paper if you've let the project alone for longer than that. On the other hand, you should sand between coats if there are rough spots, brush marks, orange peel, overspray, or bits of dust in the finish. Use the finest grit that will level the surface, leaving it smooth enough for the next coat.

Remember that there is no regular monthly meeting in July so the Library will <u>not</u> be open for book returns or to check out any items. Also, I am always looking for recommendations for new book, video or DVD purchases. Just have the name of the item and the author's name. All suggestions are seriously considered. *Dic Drees*



### **Rules for Tool Auction 2007**


Open to all members and invited guests. Space is available for FVWWCers wishing to sell woodworking tools and related items. -

### Rules below apply to ALL. -

- Items must be of a woodworking nature.
- All items are guaranteed by seller to be in working order, unless specified "As Is".
- Seller has the right to bid on their items to protect the selling price.
- No large quantities of lumber.
- Cash is the method of payment.
- Low value items may be grouped by auctioneer for the purpose of expediting sale.
- Items will be sold in the order of Registration. If more than one DuPage Non-member is registered we will alternate between DuPage members and non-members.
- A 10% selling fee will be charged on items sold for non-members. (Rounded to the nearest dollar).
- Once an item is sold it becomes the responsibility of the buyer.
- All buyers and sellers must register and have a buyers number to participate.
- If a seller must leave before the auction ends, a check for the sellers proceeds will be issued by the club.
- This is meant to be a fun event. Common sense will prevail.

At end of the auction it is the responsibility of each seller to remove all their unsold items.
