Secretary's Report DPWW Board Meeting – December 2, 2019

George Rodgers opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. Present were Jim Harvey, Bruce Kinney, Whit Anderson, Mark Wieting, Jeff Kramer, Tony Evansky, Lee Nye, Peter D'Attomo, Mike Perry, Tom Olson, Bill Hoffman, Tim McAuley, OBrian Parks, and Jerry Johnson.

The November minutes and treasurer's report were approved. Bill Hoffman will organize an auditing committee. [Post meeting note: Article I, item e of the By-Laws specifies the committee will consist of three Club members who have not held office during the year being audited.]

Standing Committee Reports

Membership (*Mike Kalscheur*) – For Mike, George reported we have a total membership of 189. About 2/3 of the 2019 members have renewed for 2020.

Library (Tom Olson) – Tom introduced **Tim McAuley** who will be working with him on the library. He also described a toy program of another wood club and said another book has been added to the library. This led to a discussion of renewing the program where a short synopsis or book report in the newsletter would be a good way to inform the membership of this resource.



Prizes (*Bruce Kinney***)** – Thanks to Black Friday and Bruce's diligence, the prizes for 2020 have all been purchased with the exception of two items.

Toys (George Rodgers) – George introduced OBrian Parks who will be replacing him as Toys Chair in 2020. It was noted that the club owes many thanks to Gail Trainor (Harry's wife) with her quilt group, and Linda Olson (Tom's wife) for providing 200 and 50 quilts respectively for the doll beds. Quite a feat and enhancement to the doll beds.

Newsletter (*Jim Harvey***)** – Jim and OBrian will put guidelines/requirements for toys in a future newsletter edition.

From Our Workshop (*Lee Nye*) – Lee has a good supply of prizes going into the new year.

Activities (Jeff Kramer) – There was a good turnout for the Village Woodwright shop tour, Activities coming up are the holiday party and the Chicago School of Woodworking.

Programs (Wayne Maier and Rick Ogren) --. The December meeting is replaced by the holiday party. To get the 2020 holiday season preparation started early, **Paul Pyrcik** will conduct a program on Turned Ornaments.in January, 2020.

A/V (*Mike Perry*) – The board continued to discuss what upgrades are necessary to provide a satisfactory

a/v experience for our members. The discussion centered on the power, speed and memory requirements of a new computer. It was reaffirmed that the board authorized \$2,000 for a computer at the November meeting. Mike will continue the search for a suitable computer.

Web (Whit Anderson) – The new board members have been added to the board mailing list created and maintained by Whit on the web site.

Old Business

- -- Committee on Club's role in estate dispositions. Speaking for the committee, Peter offered some potential guidelines that could be included in the policy statement; e.g. "the club would only serve in an advisory role." This would not preclude an individual from assuming a lead position in the disposition but it would not be a club function. There is more work to be done to address questions an example of which is, does it matter if the estate is of a member?
- -Peter reported planning for the holiday party is going well We have 48 signed up to date.

On Saturday, November 16, 17 DPWW members visited *Ed Bouvier's* Village Woodwright shop in Wheaton. Ed toured us through his two buildings, which provide significant workspace for his redemption and restoration work, and a classroom to accommodate the classes he teaches.

Ed explained his focus on restoring antique and unique pieces as wells as his interest in teaching shop, focusing primarily on traditional hand tool work. He also showed us one of the jigs (a long plane was a miter shooting board) he created to help him with his work. Throughout our visit Ed willingly answered all our questions.

All participants expressed their appreciation to Ed, and expressed the shared opinion that this was an interesting, educational visit.





November Meeting Recap

Our presenter at the DPWW November meeting was Jim Harvey (me) who introduced members to the first step in restoring an old tool: Rust Removal. His preferred method is electrolysis and Jim showed examples of the equipment he uses. A five gallon bucket, steel electrodes, a handful of Arm and Hammer Washing Soda, a couple of brass brushes, and an old ten amp battery charger. These items are with reach of almost any woodworker. For details see Jim's Weblog page, or just Google "Electrolysis Rust Removal". The photo at right is a 100 year old Zenith plane half cleaned to show before and after. Chemical techniques were also discussed.
