DuPage Woodworkers Board Meeting October 3, 2022

George Rodgers opened the Zoom meeting at 7:05 p.m. Present were Board members Jim Harvey, Bruce Kinney, Bill Hoffman, Jeff Kramer, Mark Wieting, Howard Peterson, Lee Nye, Tim McAuley, and Jerry Johnson. Organization members David Wesolowicz

and ${\it Bruce Metzdorf}$ also attended the board meeting as guests.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.



President's Report:

The church golf outing received good support from our organization. The school's fundraising auction will be in November and George will collect items at the October general meeting. George and Wayne evaluated a request from the church to build a platform but felt the project was too large for our group.

Treasurer's Report:

In the absence of *Lou Meli*, George gave a brief overview of our finances as a Treasurers Report.

Standing Committee Reports

Membership (*Mike Kalscheur*) – George reported for Mike who is ill. Mike reported that we have two new members, for 196 total. Mike is preparing to send out membership renewal requests around October 8. To save postage new membership cards will be included.

Nomination Committee - Mike has made progress in filling the slate for coming election but still needs a secretary and a little more help on AV and Publicity.

Library (*Tim McAuley*) – Tim is seeing increased activity in the library now that the new software is up and running.

Prizes (*Bruce Kinney*) — Door prizes are breaking even. It was affirmed we would continue, although the number and value of items may need to change.

Publicity (*Keith Rosche*) – No report.

Toys (George Rodgers) – The fall workshop is Oct. 8 at Woodcraft in Woodridge. Rick Ogren and Ron Colliander have helped make car bodies and George has been handling the doll beds, but he could use some help. Beds are popular with the groups we donate to but this year we bought wood, about \$600 worth.

Newsletter (*Jim Harvey*) – *Jim Harvey* said Oct. 7 is the deadline for submitting articles. He has 17 items for From Our Workshop.

From Our Workshop (*Lee Nye*) – More gift certificates have been purchased.

Activities (*Jeff Kramer*) – A shop visit to *Doug Carroll's* home is scheduled for November 12.

Programs (*Jeff Kramer*, *Don Pellegrini*) October has member *Chad Montgomery* on making stringed

instruments, focusing on a ukulele. November will be a short presentation, perhaps Jeff himself on his recent experience at **Marc Adams School's** basics course. The Winter Banquet will be held on Monday, December 12 at Reserve 22.

A/V (*Howie Peterson*) – George and *Wayne Maier* completed constructing an extension for the top of the A/V cabinet so all of our equipment can be contained.

Web (*Bill Hoffman*) – *Bill Hoffman* said *John Zurales* has volunteered to help with the site.

Old Business:

- By-Laws Document Update: *Mark Wieting* has volunteered to assume the leadership of the Constitution and ByLaws committee.
- Non-Profit Status: No apparent progress on gaining not-for-profit status from the State of Illinois, but George will inquire about our status.
- **Insurance review:** It would be helpful if a member of DPWW with insurance expertise could review our policy and discuss it with the board.
- To Zoom or not to Zoom: It had been suggested that we consider moving some of our board meetings to Zoom, which was the case for this meeting. We decided to keep the first meeting of the year face-to-face so board members could get to know one another and perhaps use Zoom in winter months or when other circumstances make Zoom the best option.

New Business:

- George reported that he was approached by a company suggesting we run articles they have authored on woodworking subjects. After discussion the board unanimously decided to reject this offer as there is plenty of professionally written material available to our members.
- George and *Mike Kalscheur* have received emails from a local company that needs to recruit paid staff asking if we can help them recruit. Although the board decided not to broadcast to all of our members, we will consider an activity at the company's location next year that might help both our organization's members and the company.




What We Really Did Most of the Time

Being painted and covered with exterior polyurethane it should hold up well for a number of years. I did coat the areas of exposed end grain with epoxy to minimize moisture absorption.
