DuPage Woodworkers Board Meeting — February 3, 2025

George Rodgers opened the Zoom meeting at 7:00pm.

** Introductions were given to welcome John Wiedemann to our group. John will be taking on the newsletter responsibilities.

Agenda Additions, Changes and Approval – It was proposed to continue discussions concerning the holiday party as part of Old Business. The Board approved the January 6 meeting minutes.

Treasurer's Report: (*Dave Wesolowicz*) — The DPWW cash balance at the end of January stands at \$9,588. The Treasurer has filed the necessary state and federal returns for the year. Three non-board member volunteers completed a successful annual audit of our books.

Standing Committee Reports:

Membership (*Mike Kalscheur*) – We currently have 221 members of which three new came in during January. There are approximately 30 members that have yet to renew their membership for 2025. It was noted that we are beginning to pick up a few younger members.

Library (*Tom Kubica*) – We are continuing to receive some book / magazine donations from our members. Several donations are expected by our meeting.

Publicity (Mark Wieting) – No report

Prizes (*Bruce Kinney*) — February's 1st place prize will be a Craftsman Drill / Driver set with a set of bits. 2nd place will be a 7 piece Forstner bit set and an LED shop light. A rebate on the purchase of the prizes will be coming from Menards and converted to cash for the benefit of the club.

Toys *(George Rodgers)* – The first toy workshop for 2025 will be on Saturday, April 26th, at Woodcraft in Downers Grove.

Newsletter (Jim Harvey/John Wiedemann) - Articles

are due by Friday, February 7. There will be an article included on the upcoming Glenbard school shop visit. The newsletter will include 15 to 16 FOW projects. John Wiedemann is learning about the newsletter process and learning the associated software. He will begin to take over the newsletter publishing.

From Our Workshop (*Lee Nye*) – Clamps have been secured as random presenter prizes for the February meeting. Each clamp is two feet and there are a total of four clamps.

Activities (*Vaibhav Konanur*) — The Glenbard school shop visit will be on February 12 at 7pm. This is a Wednesday evening. Arrangements to visit a cabinet maker's shop is planned for the March activity.

Programs (*Bruce Metzdorf*) — The February program will feature *John Zurales* on micro jig projects. March will feature *Dave Wesolowicz* on scroll sawing. April will feature *Bruce Metzdorf* on pattern routing.

A/V (Howard Peterson) – No report

Web (*Bill Hoffman*) — Two people have started to assist with web development and maintenance. We are beginning to look at the new web site plans. It was suggested, and agreed to, that a deadline be set for submission of FOW projects so that we can ensure they are ready for general member meetings. All submissions will need to be entered by no later than 6pm on the Sunday prior to the general member meetings. It was also suggested and agreed to purchase a DPWW copy of the publisher software that allows for conversion of the online FOW submissions to a PowerPoint format. The cost is \$100 per year.

Tools *(Gordon Brand)* – Several tools have been donated to the DPWW and will soon appear in the classifieds. This Saturday Gordon is visiting a tool shop that will soon be liquidated. More information will be available after that visit.

Clothing (Carl Shaffer) - No report

Old Business:

a. **Holiday Party** – *George Rogers* – The question was raised whether we should look at alternatives to the annual Holiday Party that may attract more participation. Cost was cited a a factor in the lower participation. Several alternate locations were suggested as possibilities that will be explored. Another alternative is to have something at the


Toys 2025

January 2025 Meeting Recap

Our DPWW President *George Rodgers* presented his jigs and methods for building small boxes with splined corners. He recommends buying 6/4 stock and resawing to suit. He will cut the sides to length first, then miter the edges on a crosscut sled. George's favorite finish is Shellac. It dries quick and smells better than oil. Slots for inserting splines are made on a special jig.

George builds the whole box intact, then cuts off the lid. One tip is to not cut all the way through when freeing the lid. Leave a thin sliver of wood to support the lid then finish later with a knife. He makes heavy use of a story board (below) to locate the various cuts.






